\$100,000 for Spinal Injury Resulting in Paralysis for only \$22 a year

Every day in Australia someone is paralysed through a spinal cord injury. Half occur on the road, and alarming almost a third occur through falls. We are all at risk.

Here is an opportunity to support a charitable organisation, working to prevent workplace injuries, and in the process become eligible to claim \$100,000 financial assistance if it ever happens to you.

Normal workers compensation covers you only for injuries sustained on the job, and compensation claims/settlements can take months or even years to process.

However consider this: 24 hour cover, anywhere including home.

The Paraplegic Benefit Fund (PBF) is a not-for-profit charitable organisation commenced in WA in 1984. They are particularly active in injury prevention both in the workplace and in high schools. A powerful presentation from someone who is now in a wheelchair following a workplace incident, such as a fall, is available to come onsite.

Importantly PBF members are eligible to claim **\$100,000** of early financial assistance if they sustain a spinal cord injury resulting in paralysis. The cost has been discounted for Master Builder members to only \$22 per year, per staff member. The cover is 24hrs a day, not just in the workplace, and eligible claims are paid in the first few weeks following an injury. Compensation claims and settlements can take years to receive; PBF aim to provide much needed immediate financial and emotional support.

PBF is not an insurance company, it is a charity, and the **benefit does not interfere with other entitlements**. Plus, PBF membership is as close to fault free as you will find.

You can therefore not only help a charity running injury prevention programs for young people and workers, you can ensure that each of your workers, and you, are eligible to claim for early financial assistance should such a tragedy happen.
