Master Builders is aware the CFMEU has recently been seeking right of entry under the WA Industrial Relations Act to investigate alleged safety breaches of the OSH Act.

This can cause confusion with builders, and their site supervisors, who at times are unaware of what rights they have when it comes to dealing with a union demand such as this (e.g. what the builder's obligations are, as well as what rights and obligations the union has to meet).
