WA Labors \$50 million Housing Innovation Fund to Boost Local Capacity

The announcement today to include a \$50 million Innovation Fund within WA Labor's Made in WA Jobs plan is welcomed by Master Builders. A fund to support innovation in construction supply chains was a key priority of Master Builders 2025 Election Platform.
